
Jimi and Flavia, affectionately known as Team Flavistry, were the fifth couple to leave the BBC show and were evicted by a combination of judges scores and the public vote.

Judges had mixed feelings about his performance and Craig Revel Horwood said Jimi appeared "pigeon toed" while Bru-no Tonioli thought the routine captured a jazz era feel and Alesha Dixon was also impressed.

Some fans called his exit "an absolute outrage" as Conservative MP Ann Widdecombe remained in the competition despite receiving the lowest score from judges.

busy week for the star of hit films such as East Is East, The Guru, Exam and It's A Wonder-





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Town hall's past on film

THE inside of Hornsey Town Hall was been frozen in time in an exhibition to mark the building's 75th anniversary.
